

2020 Census Self-Response Weekly Highlights



The Town of Yemassee in Hampton County is helping to promote 2020 Census self-response during several free COVID-19 testing events throughout the month of September in conjunction with the South Carolina Department of Health & Environmental Control and the Medical University of South Carolina. During these free, drive-through testing events, the town is handing out census flyers to each participant and urging them to self-respond if their household has not already done so. "We're committed to doing whatever is needed to ensure we get a complete count!" said Town Clerk Matt Garnes.

The Ridgeland Piggly Wiggly has agreed to host a Mobile Questionnaire Assistance (MQA) event on September 27th, and any additional days if needed. The store has also agreed to include 2020 Census flyers in grocery bags at guest checkout, to make periodic announcements over the PA system to shoppers in the store and will continue to encourage participation on social media.



In Dorchester County, St. Theresa the Little Flower Catholic Church of Summerville has promoted census self-response to its congregation throughout the month of September. More than 1,200 families received information on how to self-respond and on the fact that Census enumerators are going door-to-door to count households that have not yet responded. Additionally, church staff has emailed 2020 Census information to all their families, as well as helping to spread the word to other Catholic churches.






Serving children from birth to five years of age, the Sunbelt Human Advancement Resources (SHARE) Head Start is focusing its 2020 Census efforts on reducing the undercount of children. Staff and volunteers hosted a drive-through Open House on September 4th for parents and families at each of SHARE's 22 Head Start locations across Anderson, Greenville, Pickens, and Oconee counties. The event was a success, reaching over 900 parents and families. With the assistance of staff, several parents were able to complete their census questionnaire onsite using their mobile devices to connect online or via telephone.



Jasper County School District agreed to include 2020 Census reminders in their upcoming meal delivery event on Friday, September 25th. English and Spanish-language 2020 Census flyers will be provided to more than 1,200 families across Jasper County with each meal delivered.



The Newberry County Complete Count Committee (CCC) is pushing to finish the 2020 Census strong! The CCC is stationing committee members at high-traffic locations in low responding areas with computers and gift cards, which will allow residents to complete their questionnaire on the spot with assistance if needed. Additionally, the local Hispanic store in Newberry is allowing the CCC to setup inside/outside the store to help people complete their census.


