




CLEMSON COMMUNITY GUIDEBOOK







Built for Paul de St. Julien in 1716 in Berkley County, South Carolina, Hanover House was reconstructed on the Clemson University campus in 1941. It was relocated to the South Carolina Botanical Garden site in 1994. The house is listed on the National Register of Historic Places and is managed by Clemson University's Historic Properties department. Hanover House is closed on Clemson University holidays and home football game Saturdays.

Hunt Cabin

The restored Hunt Cabin was built around 1826 in Seneca. The Cabin was scheduled to be torn down but was purchased by the Clemson Class of 1915 for \$35 and moved to the college in 1955. The original home contained four bedrooms on the first floor and a large front porch. Currently, the Cabin has one large open room on the first floor, and the front porch is long removed. Legend has it that during the Civil War, General Sherman spent a night at the cabin and, thus, spared it during his infamous march to the sea.


